



WAKEFIELD FOUNDATION HAD EXCEPTIONAL YEAR

This has been an exceptional year. Not only did Wakefield celebrate its 50th anniversary last October, but the Foundation received \$62,374.87 in contributions, and therefore, was able to award fourteen scholarships totaling \$57,500.00 to members of the class of 2004. This brings the total raised and earned since 1986 to \$610,568.87. The Foundation has now awarded scholarships totaling \$462,500.00 to 119 graduates of Wakefield. Currently there are 42 Wakefield graduates in college receiving financial assistance in the form of scholarships from the Foundation. This has only been possible because of the generous support of Wakefield alumni as well as that of present and former teachers and staff. This year the Foundation selected three students who had outstanding scholastic records, and had received full scholarships from the schools they would be attending, to be Wakefield Scholars with one-time awards of \$500.00 as our way of saying congratulations for a job well done. Also in recognition that the costs of college have skyrocketed the amount of the regular scholarships was increased for the first time in 14 years from \$4,000.00 to \$5,000.00. The Foundation does not just pay out the scholarships. Following the end of each semester the students must submit a brief letter discussing their college experiences during the prior semester, along with an official copy of their grades so that we can determine that they are making satisfactory academic progress toward graduation prior to receiving the next installment of their scholarship. Most of the letters are very interesting. The only downside is that we have to send an individualized response to each letter so as you can see that has now reached the level of 84 letters this year. Fortunately most of the students are doing very well and their letters are easy to reply to. For instance, Jessica Garrison, who recently graduated from UVA,

reported that she had been elected to Phi Beta Kappa and Richard Davis, who graduated near the top of his class at Columbia, explained that he would be attending graduate school in Japan.

Obviously we are always coming around with our hands out asking for contributions, and this year is no exception. We need your help. We hope that as an alumnus of Wakefield you might consider including the Foundation somewhere on the list of organizations which you assist. As we say each year, we hope you will join in our little project to help some of the young people who are growing up in our old neighborhoods and attending our old high school to be able to pursue their academic goals. Be a part of it, together we can make a difference.

After the celebration, one of the committee members decided to save these scrapbooks for posterity by digitally scanning the contents to CD-ROM. From that effort came the Archives committee. The primary focus of the archives committee is twofold. It will identify and capture historically important school, student and community records held within Wakefield and establish a mechanism to capture and retain information generated by current and future Wakefield classes. Wakefield Seniors Earn \$2,675,000 in Scholarships

The awards and scholarships earned by Wakefield students are truly impressive, and too numerous to summarize here. Also of note was a full scholarship to Preston Linson-Gentry to attend Brown University. These four outstanding scholars were recognized with a small stipend for college expenses by the Wakefield Foundation.

New CD-ROM Yearbook

Hall of Fame

“Margaret Lee [Class of '56] browsed through Wakefield High School's just-released yearbook and recalled a half-century ago when she was art editor of its very first yearbook: Days turned into late, long nights immersed in pica rulers, rubber cement and black-and-white photographs.

To the yearbook staff gathered around her now, the only thing in her description that sounded familiar was the time commitment.

And for Lee, who sits on Wakefield's 50th-anniversary committee and who was visiting the Arlington County school Friday to drop off pictures, that was about the only thing that still seemed familiar. The computer screen before her displayed the contents of a compact disc – video images, audio clips, extra photographs, articles — that is tucked into the back of each printed yearbook. For the first time, the book itself was published entirely in color.

This year, Wakefield joined a growing number of schools across the country that produce a yearbook for tech-savvy, tech-hungry teenagers. The yearbook's supplemental CD-ROM allows viewers to choose what they want to see (the homecoming court, a special assembly) or hear (the field hockey team's giggly rendition of Wakefield's fight song) with the click of a mouse. Photos and collages flash to a musical score.

Wakefield is one of only a handful of schools in the Washington area with a CD yearbook, but several other yearbook staffs said their publications changed in other ways.“

The Wakefield Hall of Fame was created last year and the first class of inductees selected. The first class of inductees included: Dr. Harold Wilson (staff), Neal Haygood (staff), Edward “Eddie” Marsh (staff), Hunter “Patch” Adams ('63), Peter Arntson ('56), Henry Hudson ('65), William Newman ('68) and Conchita Saulmon Mitchell ('66). The intent of the Hall of Fame is to recognize those alumni and staff who have made significant contributions to society and who have brought acclaim or recognition to Wakefield. Those selected for the Hall of Fame should have a widespread reputation, at least in their peer group. The renown of the Hall of Fame member will be associated with, and therefore a reflection on Wakefield. They should also serve as both a model and a source of pride to current students.

Criteria: Staff nominees are not eligible until five years after their time at Wakefield and cannot be currently employed by the Arlington Public Schools. Alumni nominees are not eligible until ten years after their time at Wakefield and cannot be currently employed at Wakefield. All nominees should possess impeccable character, and be good citizens and serve as a good example for Wakefield students and staff.

Guidelines: The primary intent of the Hall of Fame is to recognize alumni for their accomplishments after high school. However, significant achievement by an alumnus while a student at Wakefield can be appropriate for recognition if that achievement was well known outside of Wakefield. Similarly, for staff, the intent is to acknowledge those whose reputation of excellence extends beyond Wakefield or who have excelled in their duties by going beyond what is expected.

Nominations can be submitted by anyone by being mailed to the foundation office or emailed to wakefieldalumni@aol.com. Nominations submitted last year will be included in the evaluation process this year but new nominations are also welcome. Provide the name, address and phone number for yourself and the nominee. Provide the year that the nominee graduated from or worked at Wakefield. Provide a description of the nominee's qualifications.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT THE FOUNDATION

WHAT IS IT? A public charity established as a non-profit Corporation in Virginia in September of 1986.

ARE CONTRIBUTIONS TAX DEDUCTIBLE? Yes. The Foundation's status as a public charity has been formally recognized by the Internal Revenue Service.

WHO SET IT UP? Several Alumni of Wakefield High School.

WHERE DOES IT GET ITS FUNDS? Funds are raised annually by soliciting Alumni of Wakefield High School as well as present and former teachers and staff and hopefully from residents of South Arlington.

WHAT ABOUT UNITED WAY CONTRIBUTIONS? Yes. The Wakefield Foundation can be designated in the United Way Campaigns and the Combined Federal Campaign (CFC), as well as through America's Charities, Inc. Its designation number is 9207.

WHAT DOES THE FOUNDATION DO WITH THE FUNDS? It provides college scholarships to deserving Wakefield graduates based upon academic achievement, effort and financial need.

HOW MUCH ARE THE SCHOLARSHIPS? Beginning in May 2004, the scholarships were increased from \$4,000.00 to \$5,000.00 - paid out at the rate of \$625.00 per semester.

HOW MANY SCHOLARSHIPS WERE AWARDED TO THE CLASS OF 2004? Fourteen (14) for a total of \$57,500.00.

HOW IS THE NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS

DETERMINED? The Number of scholarships is determined by the amount raised prior to the May selection meeting. If \$50,000.00 is raised, then ten (10) scholarships can be awarded that year.

HOW MANY SCHOLARSHIPS HAVE BEEN AWARDED TO DATE? One hundred nineteen (119). All but the first four scholarships and the last 14 have been for \$4,000.00. The Foundation has paid out or committed to pay out the sum of \$462,500.00 to date.

WHAT ARE THE EXPENSES OF THE FOUNDATION? The expenses are limited to printing the solicitation letter and postage (at the bulk non-profit rate).

HOW MUCH MONEY HAS BEEN COLLECTED FOR THE FOUNDATION? Through June 30, 2004, the Foundation has raised

approximately \$549,042.00 in contributions, received over \$61,527.00 in earnings for a total of \$610,567.00 and paid about \$44,762.00 in expenses (primarily printing and postage). Because of the earnings, approximately 103% of what is raised from contributions is available for scholarships and teacher grants.

WHO MANAGES THE FOUNDATION? There are six Trustees: three Alumni, a former teacher, a former principal and the current Principal of Wakefield who is automatically an ex officio member of the Board.

WHO HOLDS THE ASSETS OF THE FOUNDATION? From the beginning the contributions have been received by and the assets of the Foundation have been held by the Trust Department of Wachovia Bank, under an agency agreement with the Foundation. All disbursements for scholarships or expenses are paid by the Bank at the written direction of the Foundation. The Bank has provided this service to the Foundation since October 1, 1986 for a minimum charge.

WHY SUPPORT THE WAKEFIELD FOUNDATION? The concept is that there have been 48 graduating classes from Wakefield and more than 18,400 graduates. It is felt that if some percentage of those graduates, as well as teachers and parents of students and graduates, and residents of the Wakefield attendance area would be willing to contribute to the Foundation annually, together we can make a difference for some of the young people who are growing up in our old neighborhoods and attending our old high school.

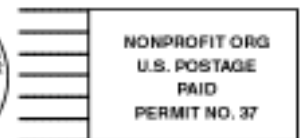
